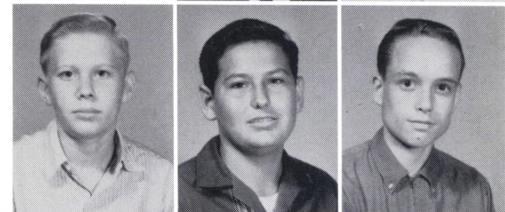
School Spirit Week
