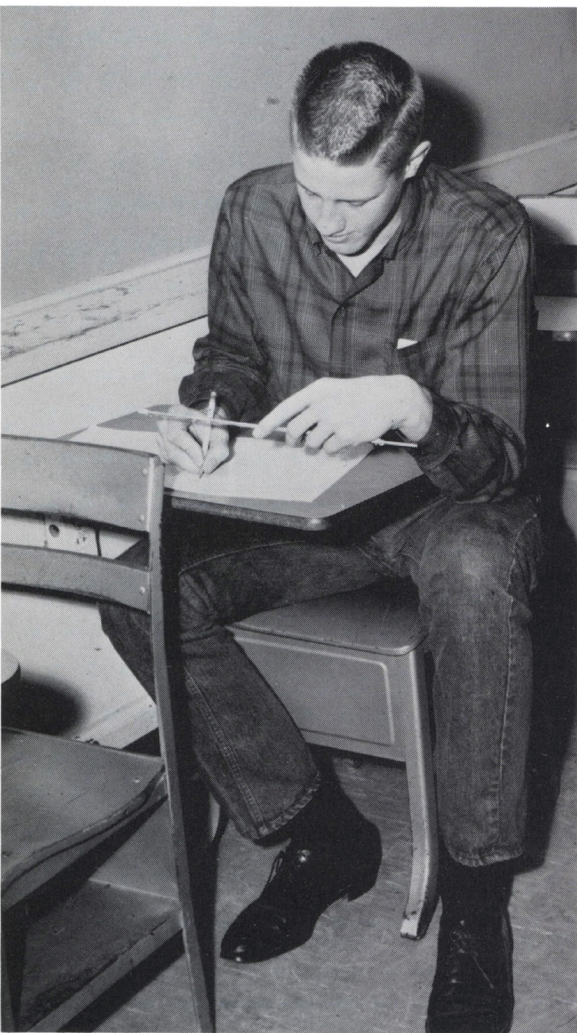


Reichelderfer and Nicholson Choice of Junior Class

Miss "Teresa" Kendrick is named winner in the beauty contest at the party.

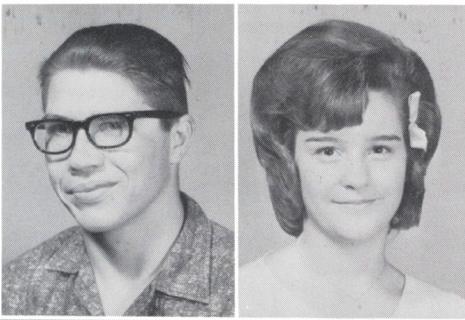

Bad losers of the beauty contest besiege the shy winner.

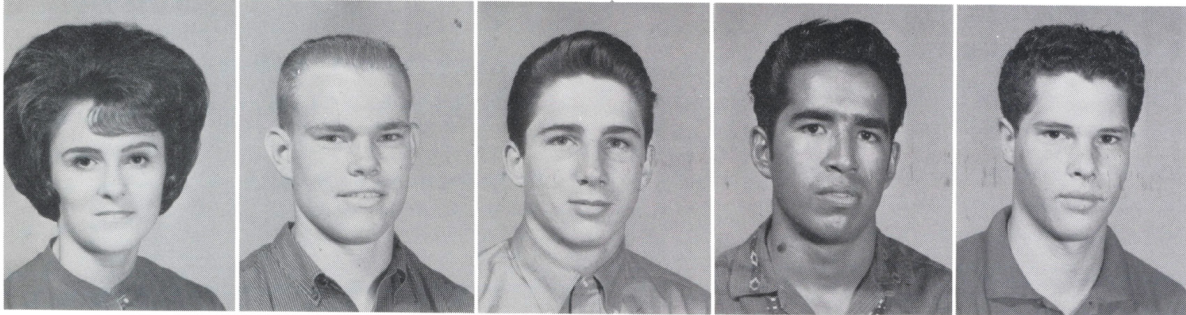

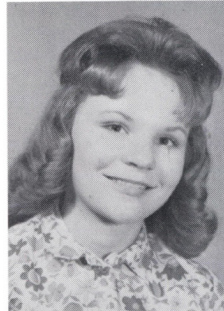


Measure Ability

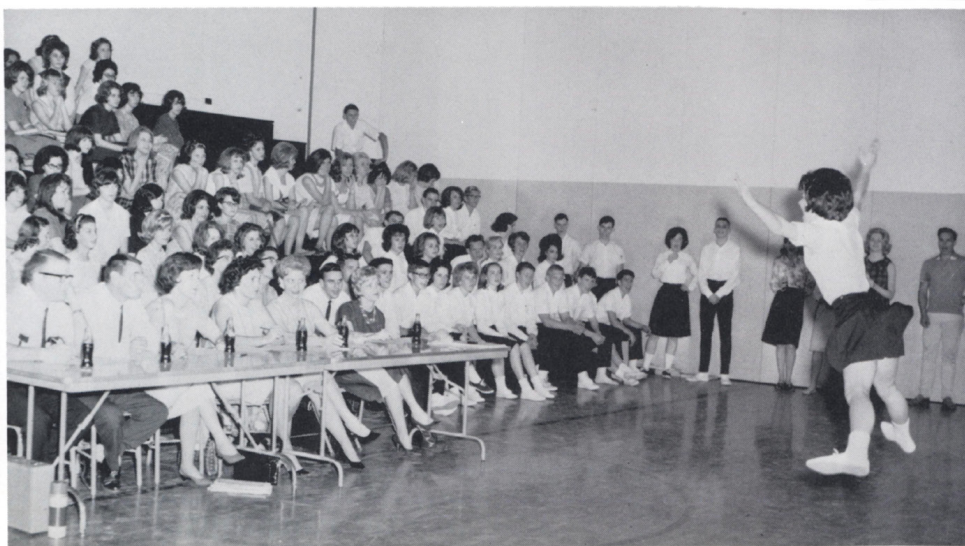
Before the tryouts, the participants are given a chance for last minute practice.

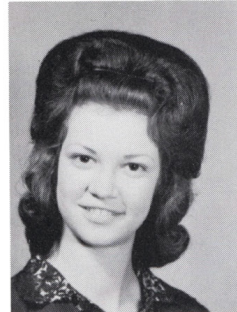


Prepares Students

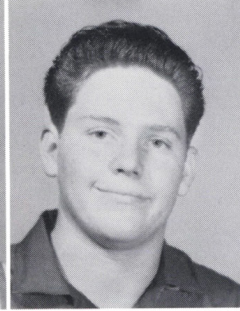
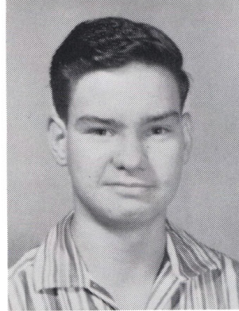
Reveal Enthusiasm
