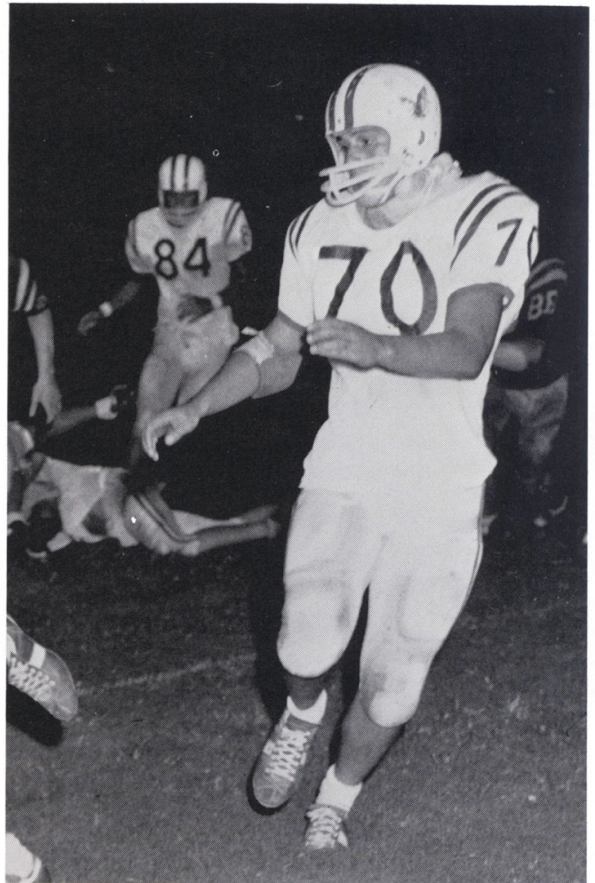


Class Dubs Parten and Wilcox as Favorites

PHS Sports 455 Graduating Seniors

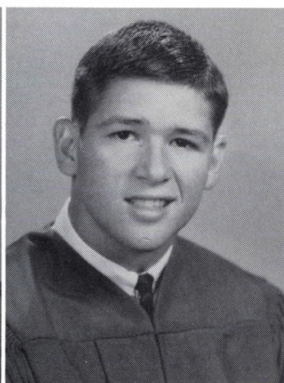

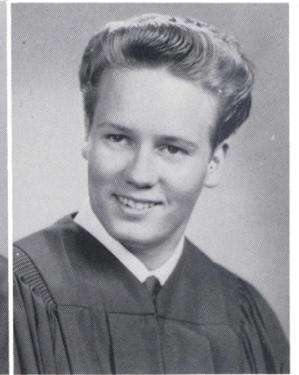
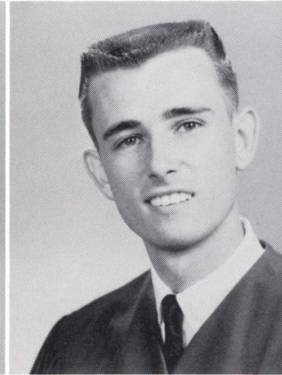
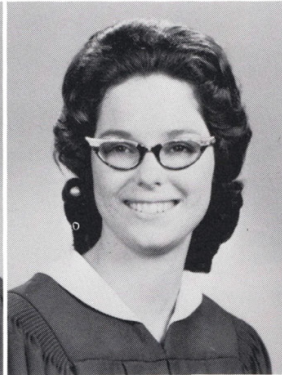
Prom, Banquet Require

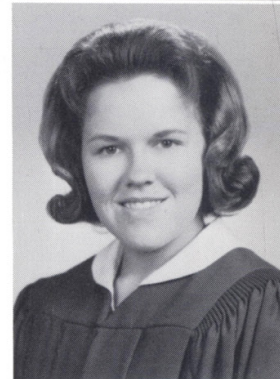
Best at PHS

The personalities of Robert and Paula are adaptable to any situation, even a pony ride.

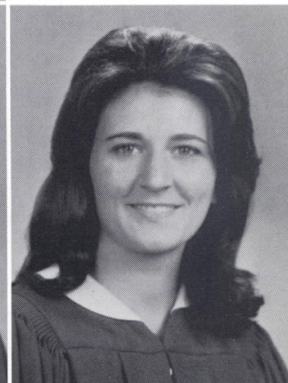
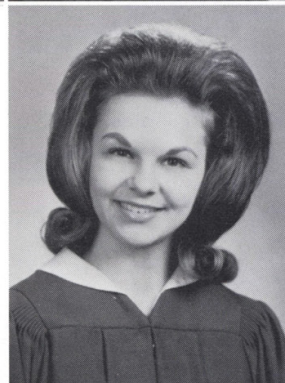

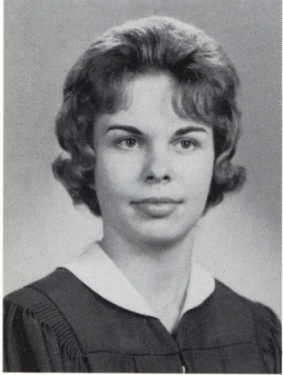
Draws Closer

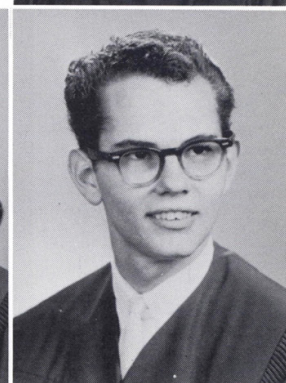
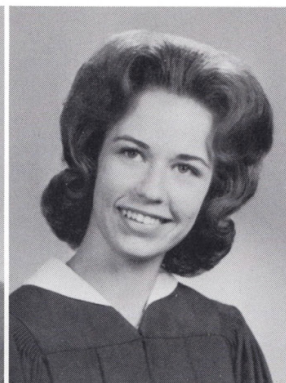
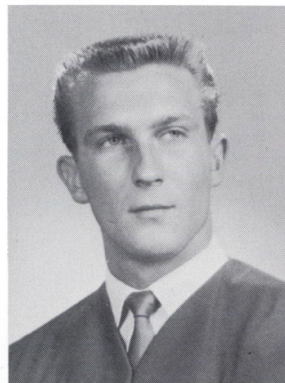
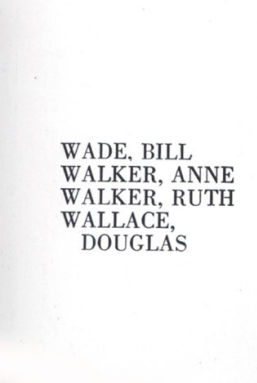
Pose for Picture
