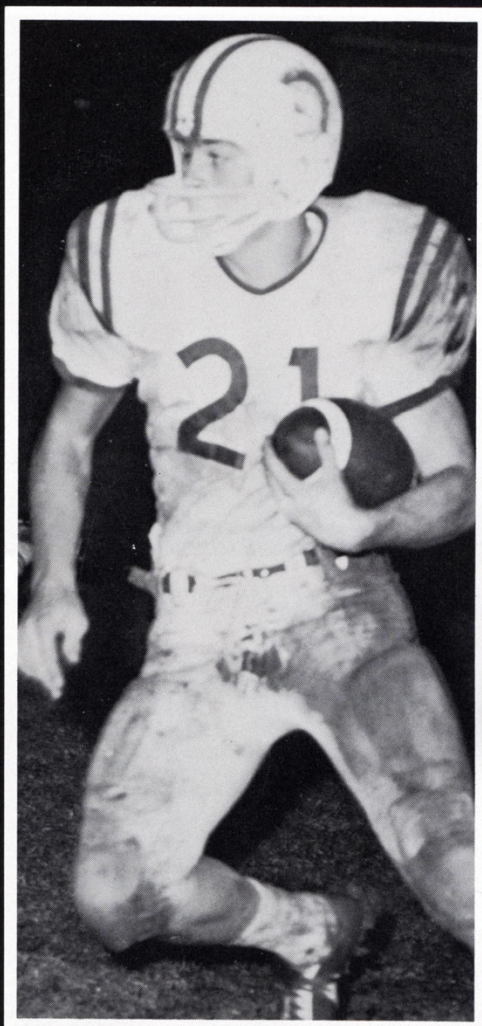

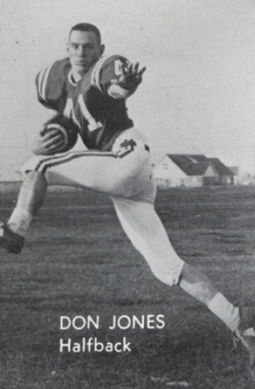

A capacity plus crowd at Memorial Stadium saw the Pasadena Eagles clip the Trojans in the season opener, September 11.

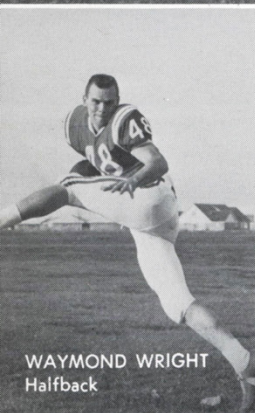

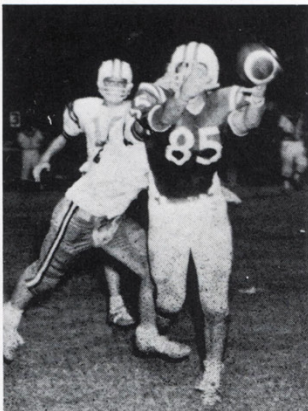

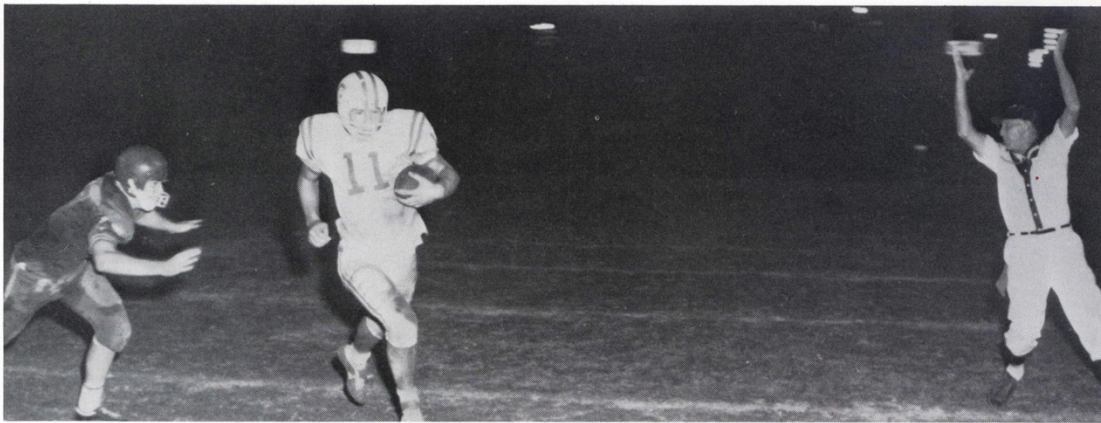


Waymond Wright scores on touchdown pass against Brazosport.

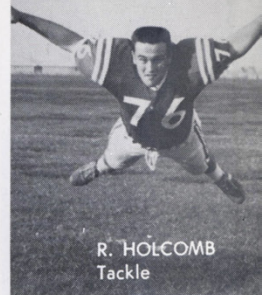

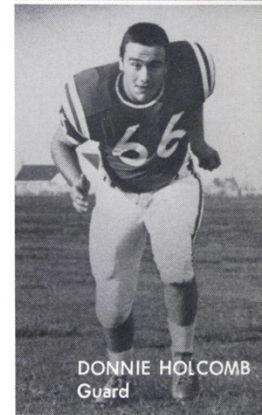
## TROJANS TAME TIGERS 41-0

After a scoreless first half, the Trojans erupted for 3 touchdowns in each of the third and fourth quarters to clobber the Springwood Tigers 41-0.

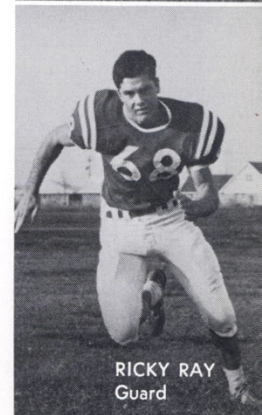

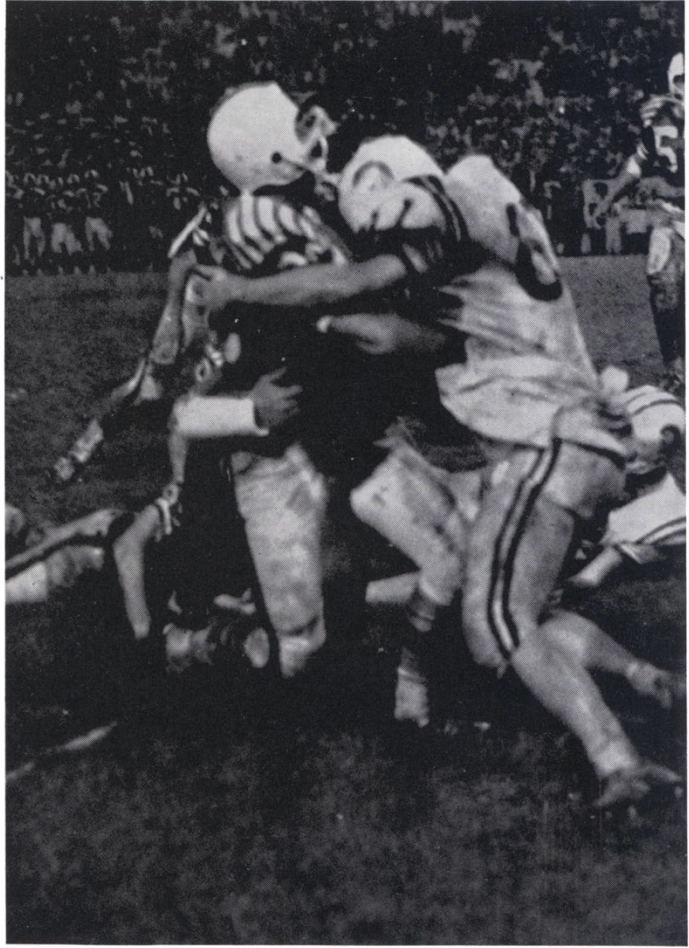

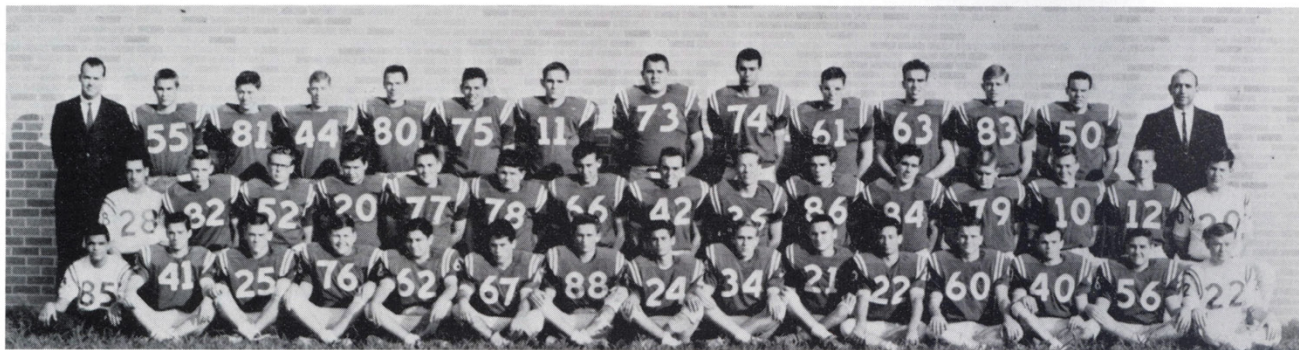

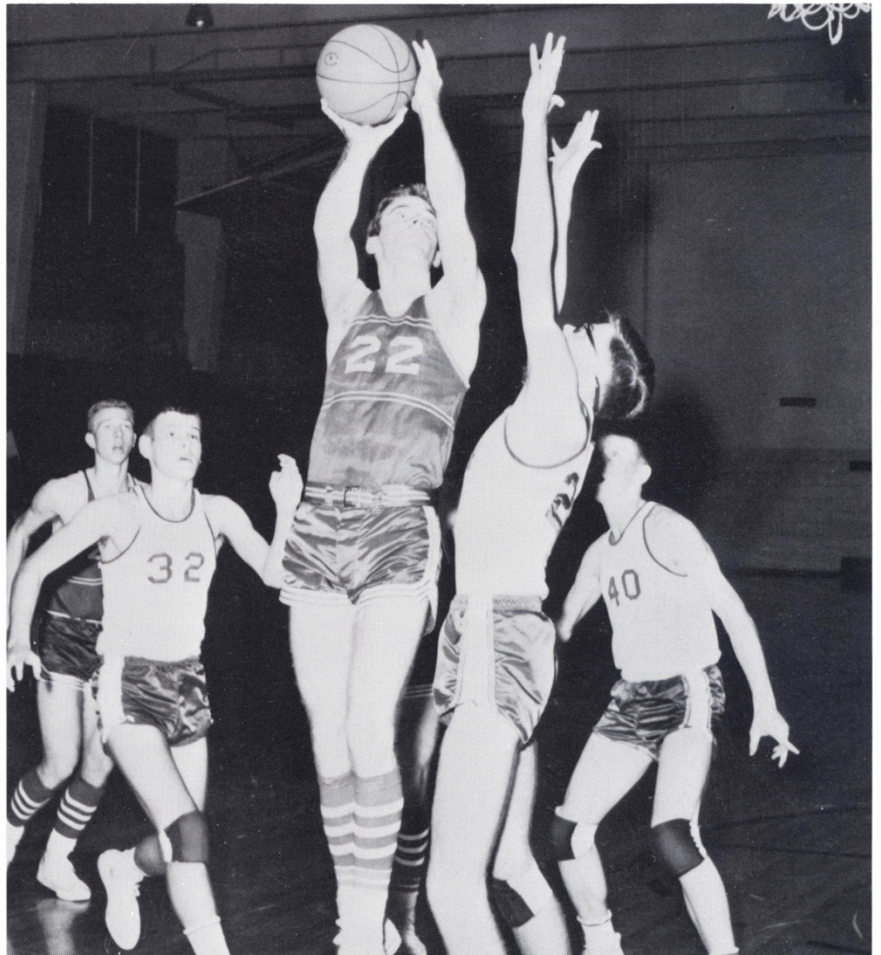

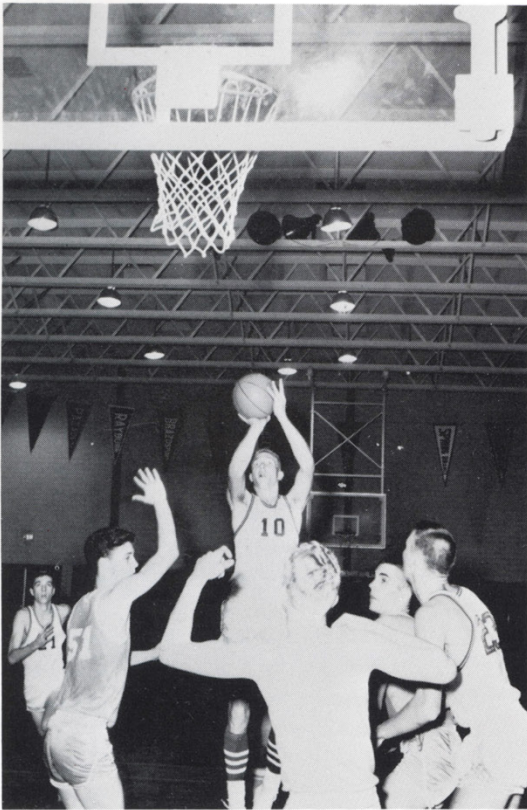

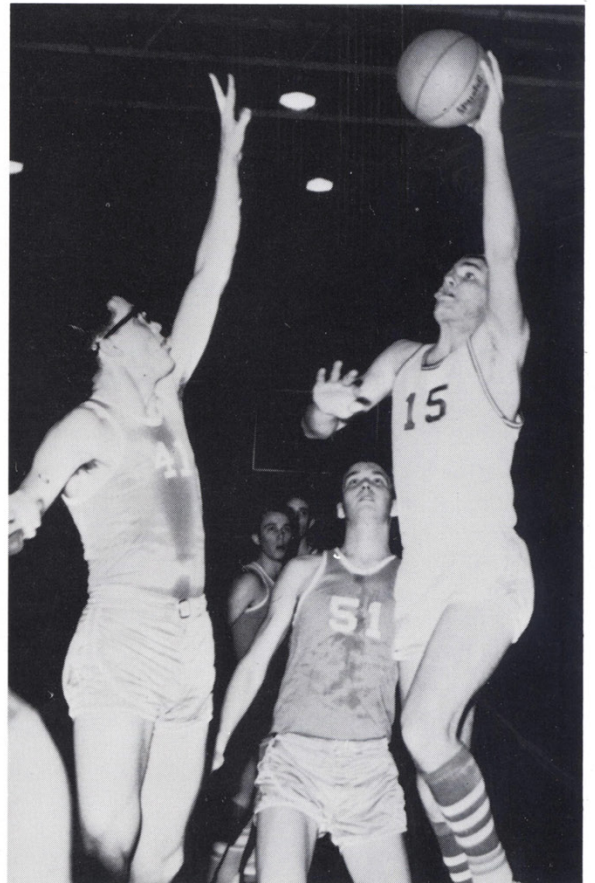

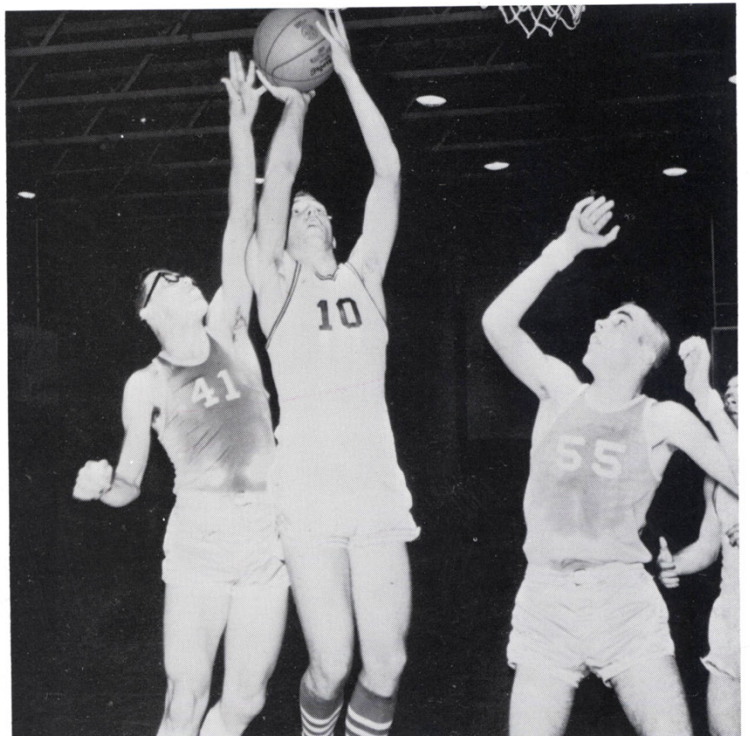

The 1965 basketball season was the most successful in Trojan basketball history. The team broke five school records this year. Mike's best effort in the discus was a heave of 174'6", while he put the shot 57'7". Mike's second place at the Region III Meet enabled him to compete in the shot at the state meet, where his toss of 56'6" earned sixth place. This did, however, display a great effort on Mike's part. 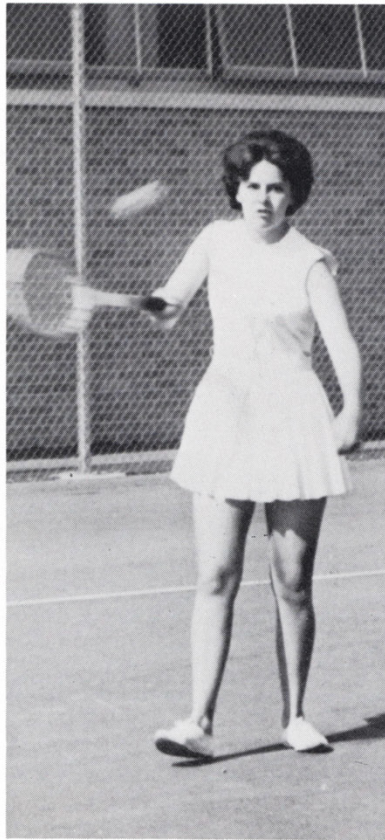

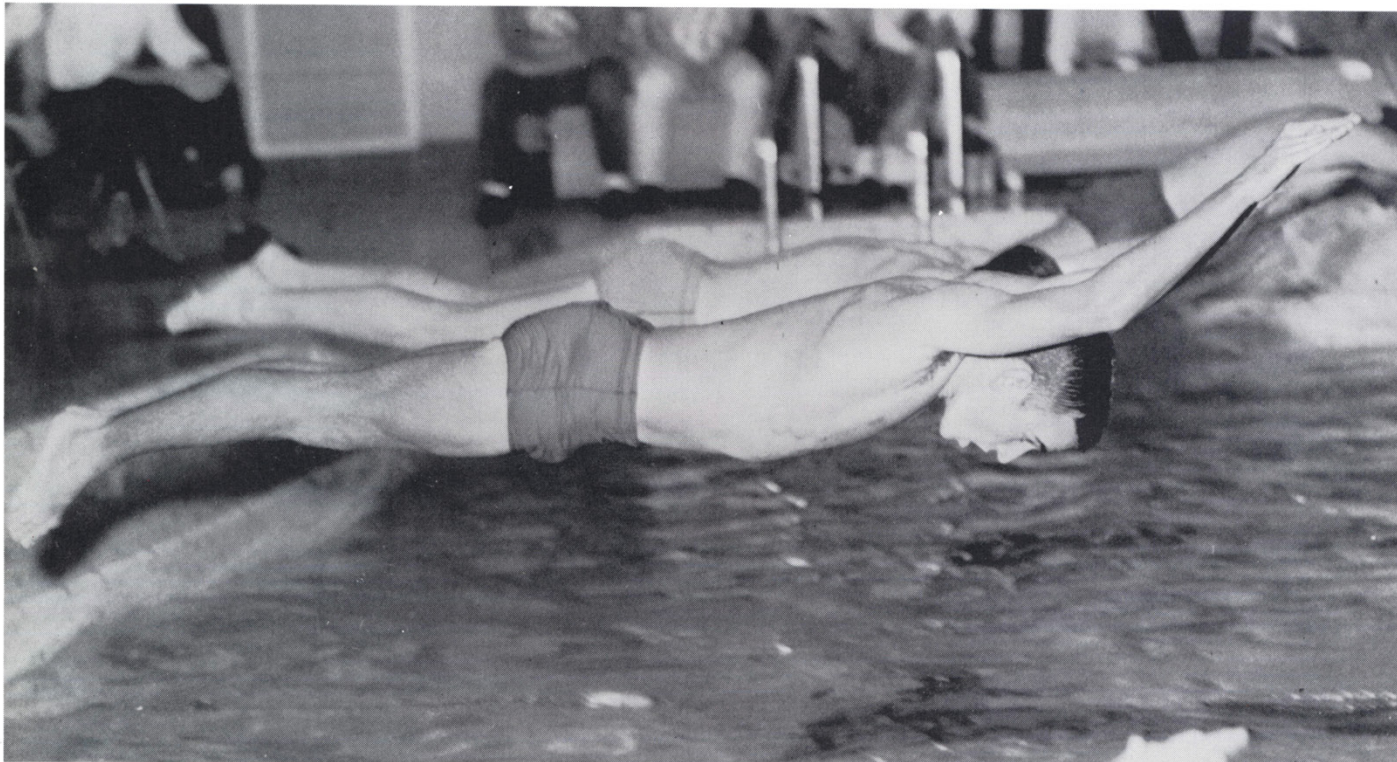
