Mr. Robert W. Coffman has served for the past 11 years as Assistant Superintendent and Business Manager .

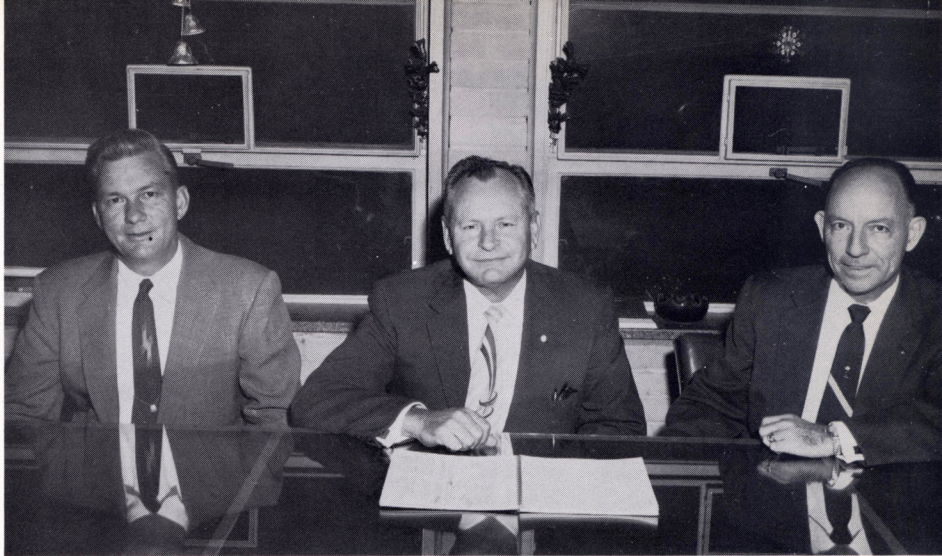


MR. ALLISON L. KOONCE, Superintendent in charge of Instruction, has served in this position since July, 1954.

In the tenth and eleventh grades the math courses are elective. Students may begin or continue the regular sequence of pure math courses.



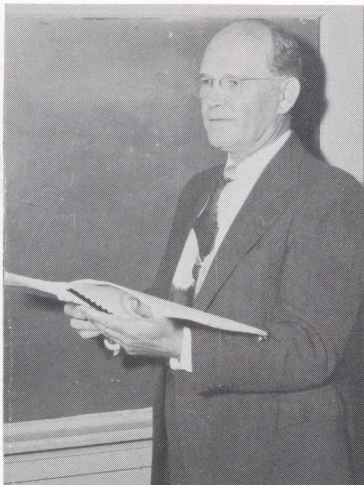

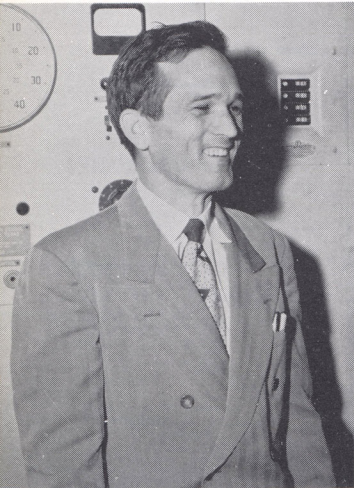

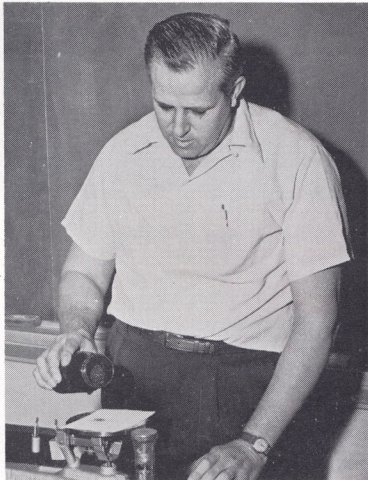

One science credit is required...

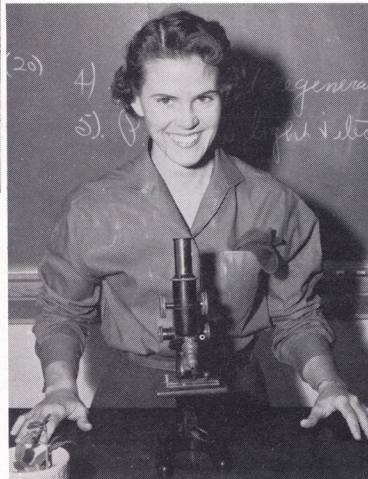
A student must take one science course in the tenth, eleventh, or twelfth grade. Applied science, chemistry, applied biology, biology, and physics are the courses offered.

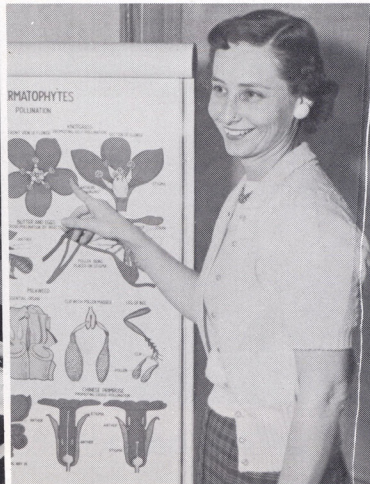

Three and one-half credits are required in Social Studies to graduate. The courses in this department are designed to prepare students as responsible and conscientious citizens of tomorrow.

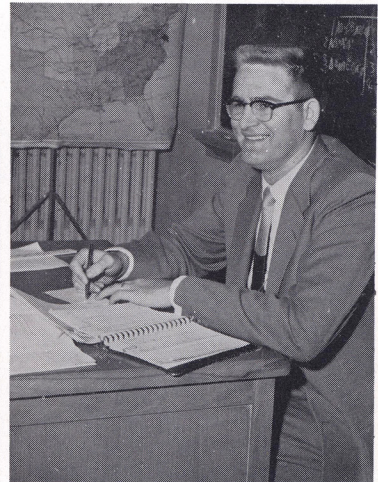
In the history classes, a background of our present government is presented. The civics course, required for all seniors explains the basic operation of our government.



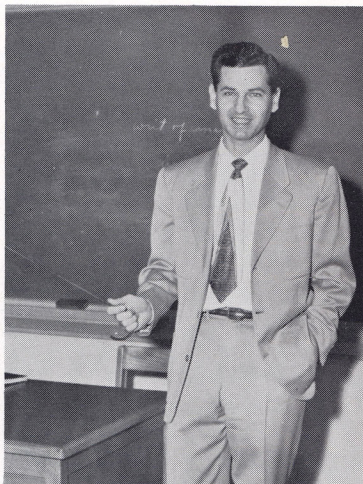

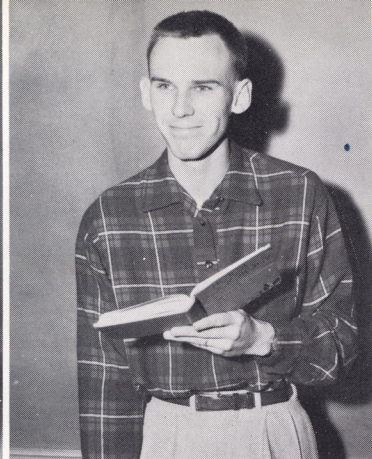

Students at Pasadena are fortunate because they are offered experiences and opportunities in homemaking which few schools surpass.

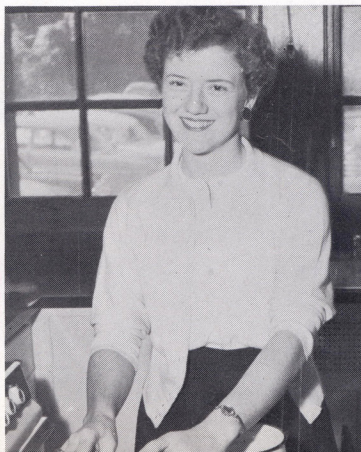
As well as learning to cook and sew, a girl can learn child care, good grooming, etiquette, meal planning and preparation, buying, and budgeting.

A home project consisting of thirty hours of work is required each semester. The girls complete this project by cooking or sewing outside of class.

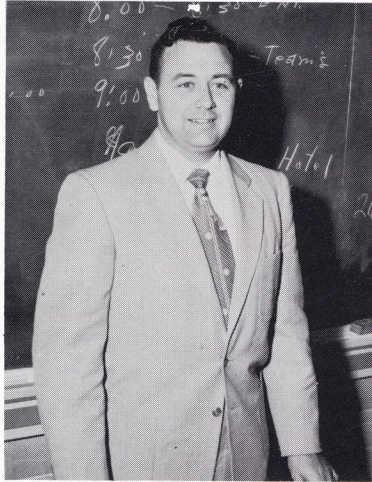

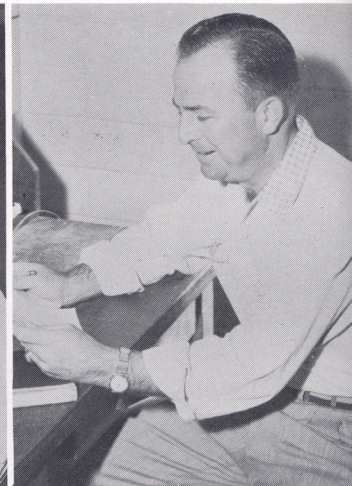

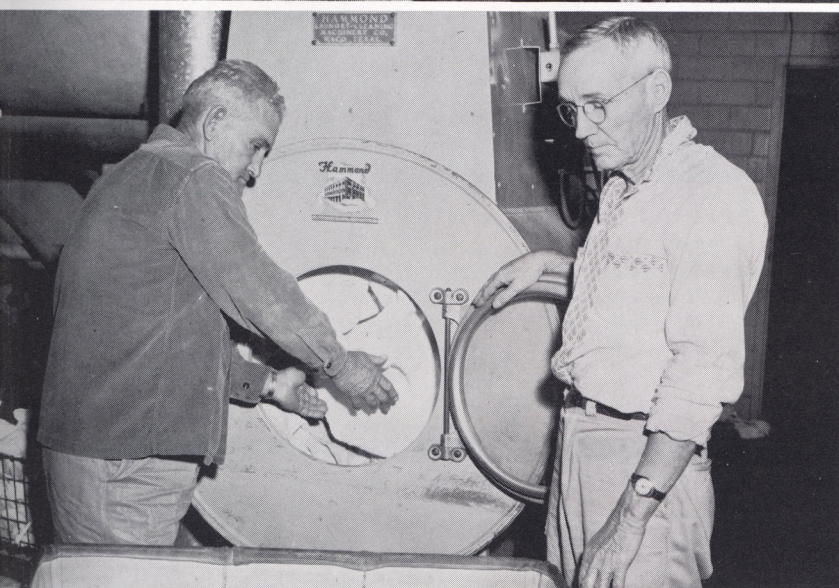
