Honor Society Coke Party

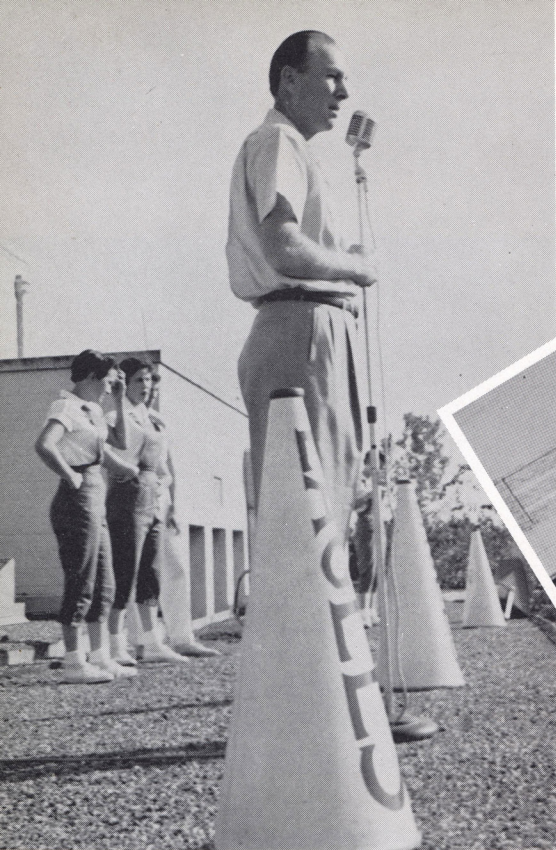

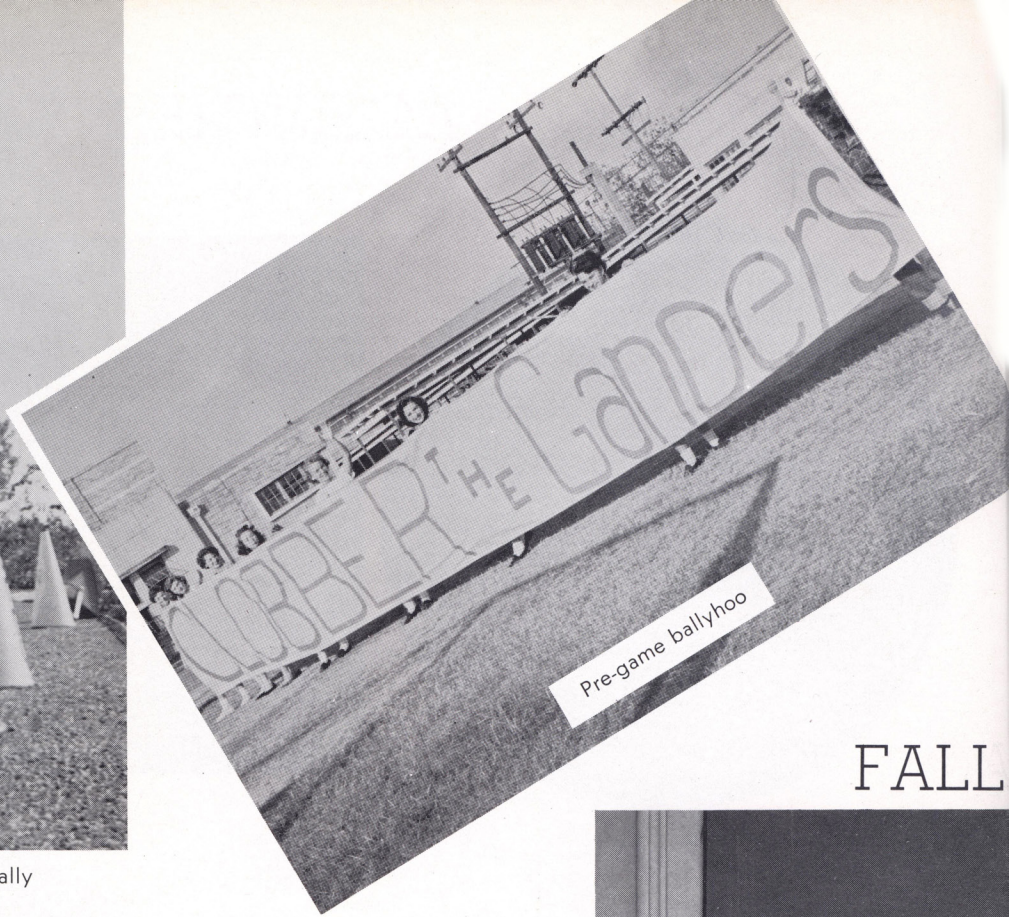

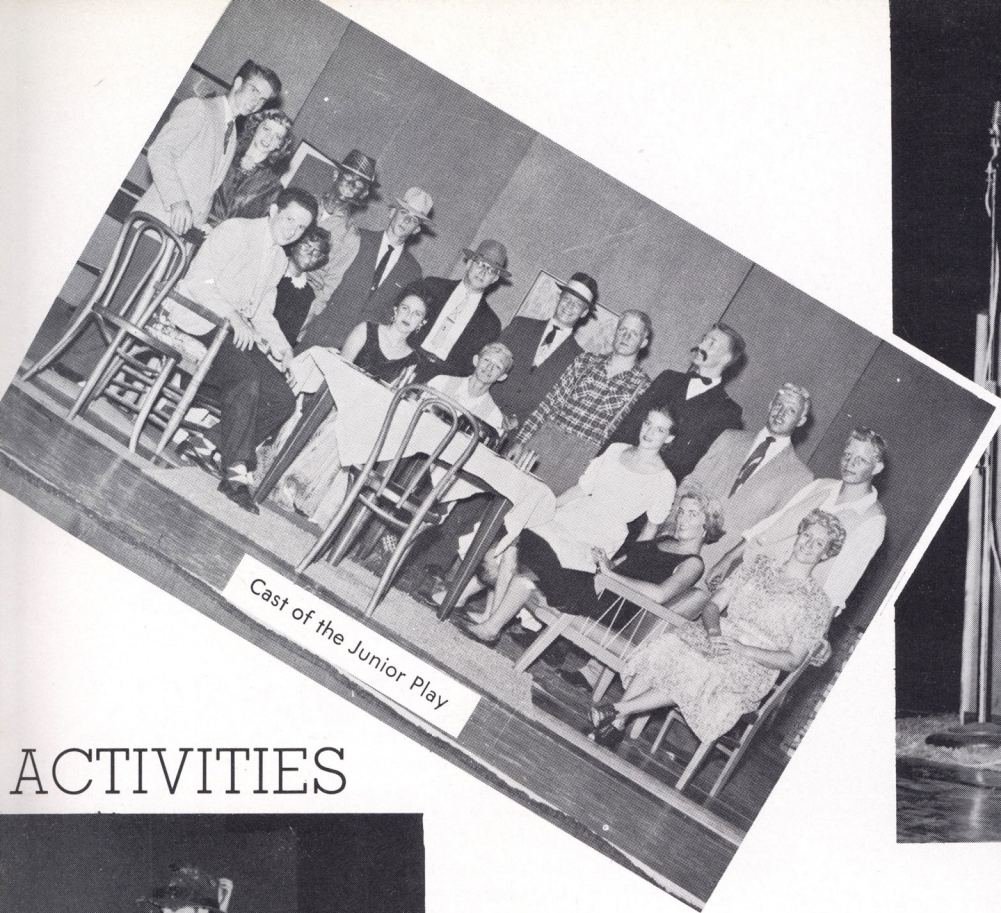

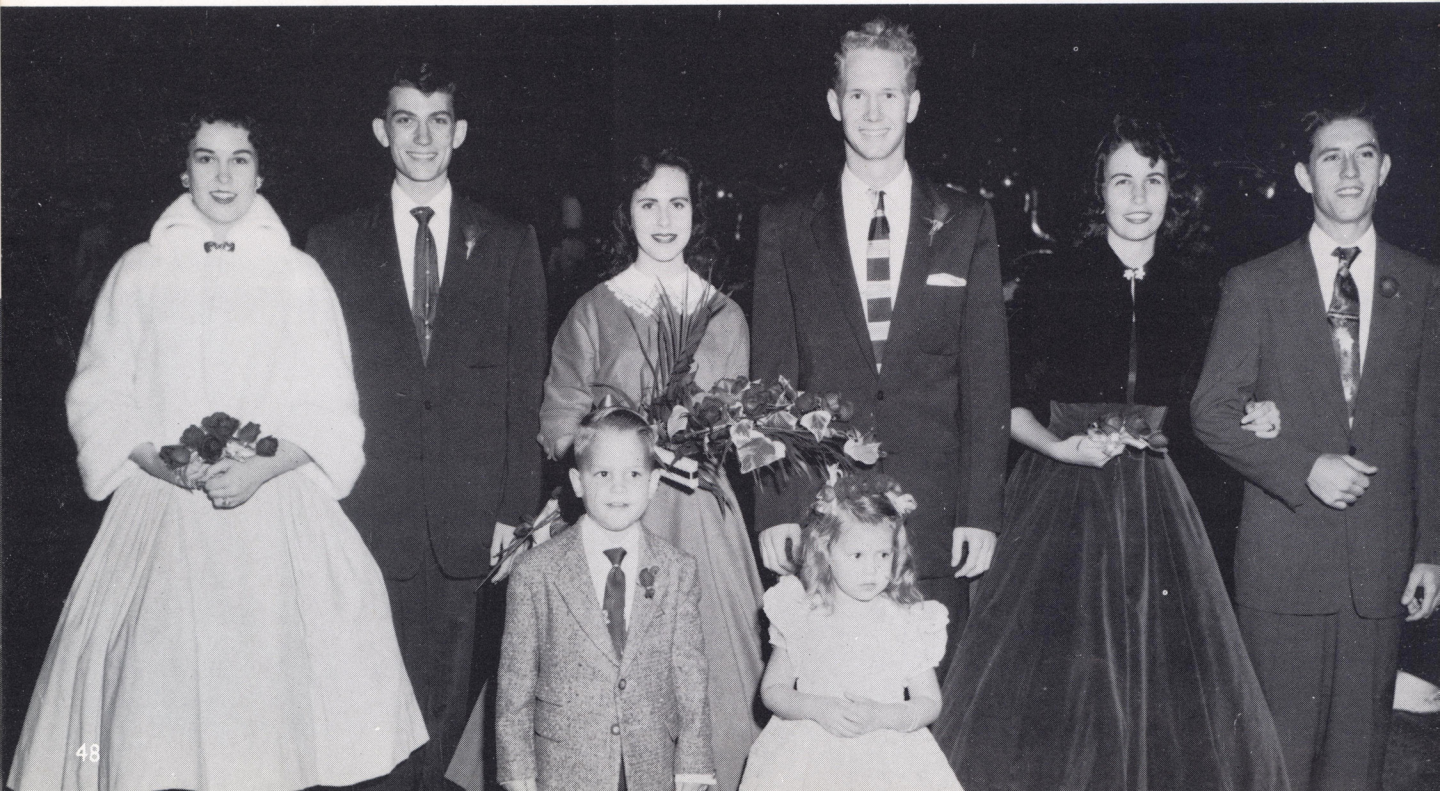

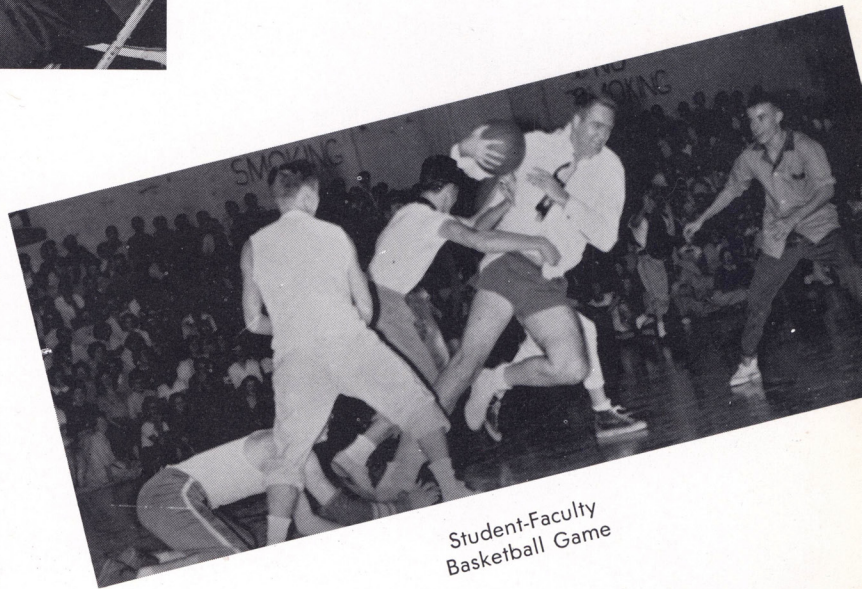
The annual Band Party is always the scene of the presentation of the Band Sweetheart—Norma Olson this year. Bingo occupies some of those who attend the Party.

# WINTER

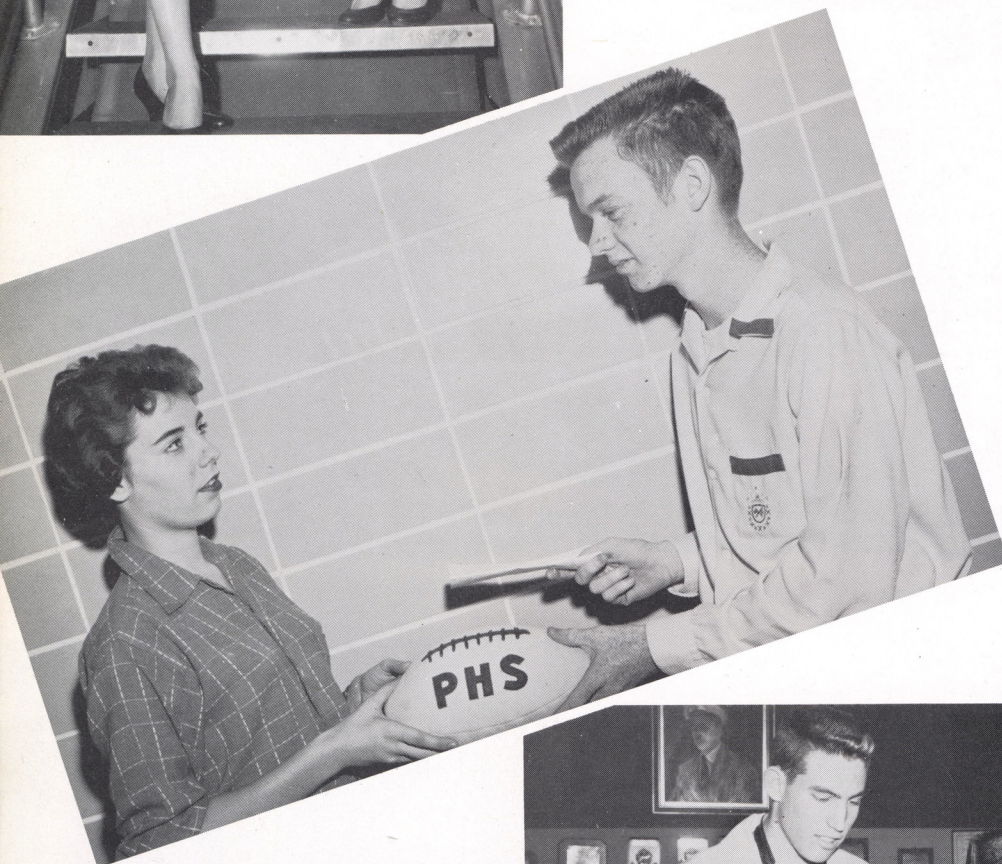

Flower: Pink Rose

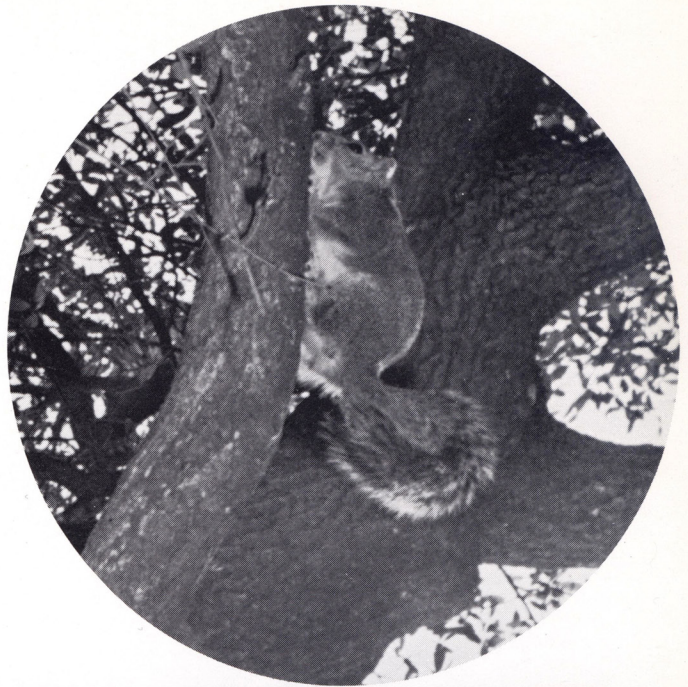
