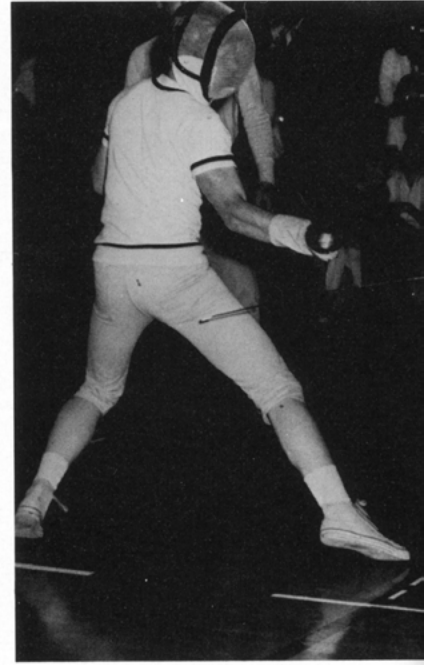

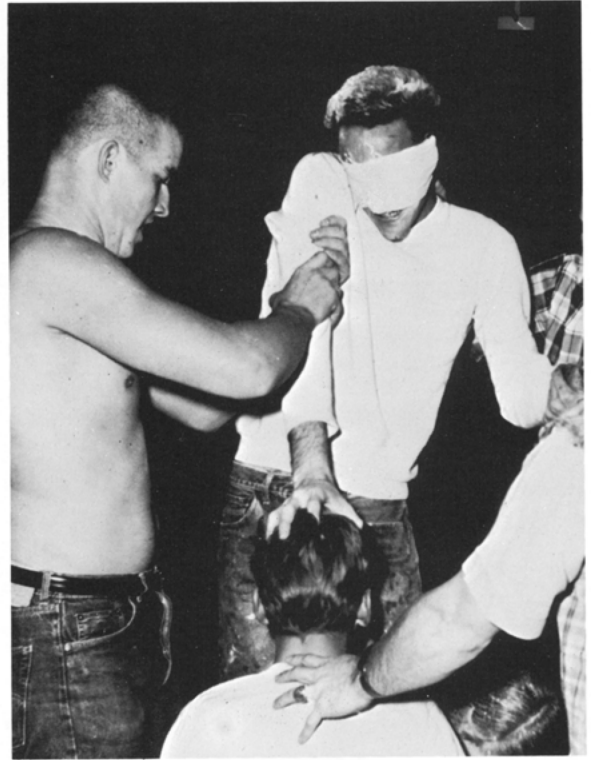
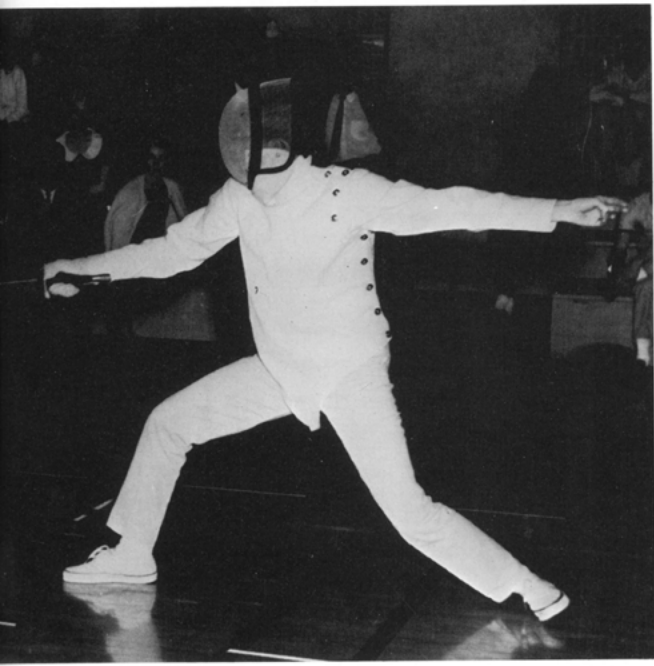




Organizations Supplement School

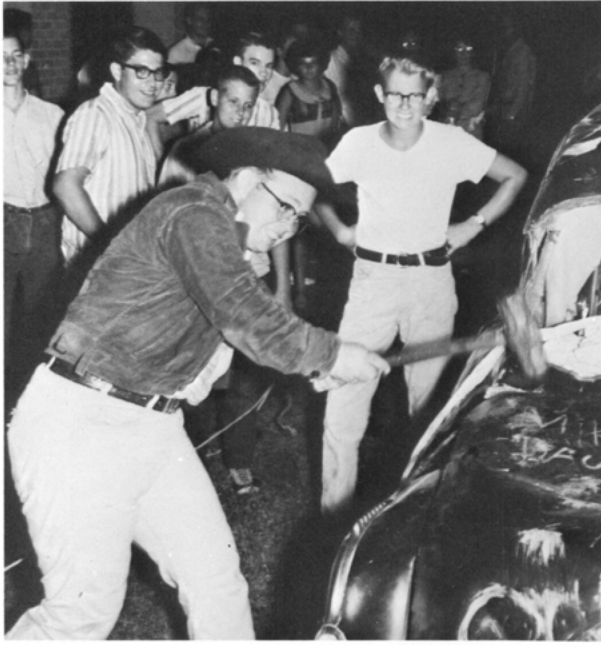

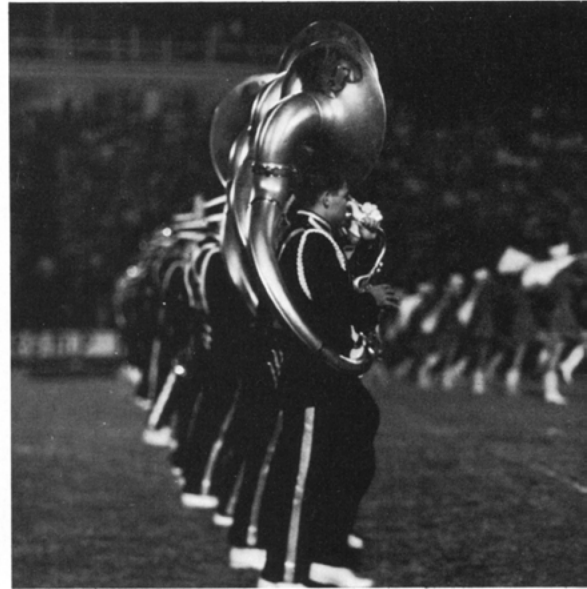

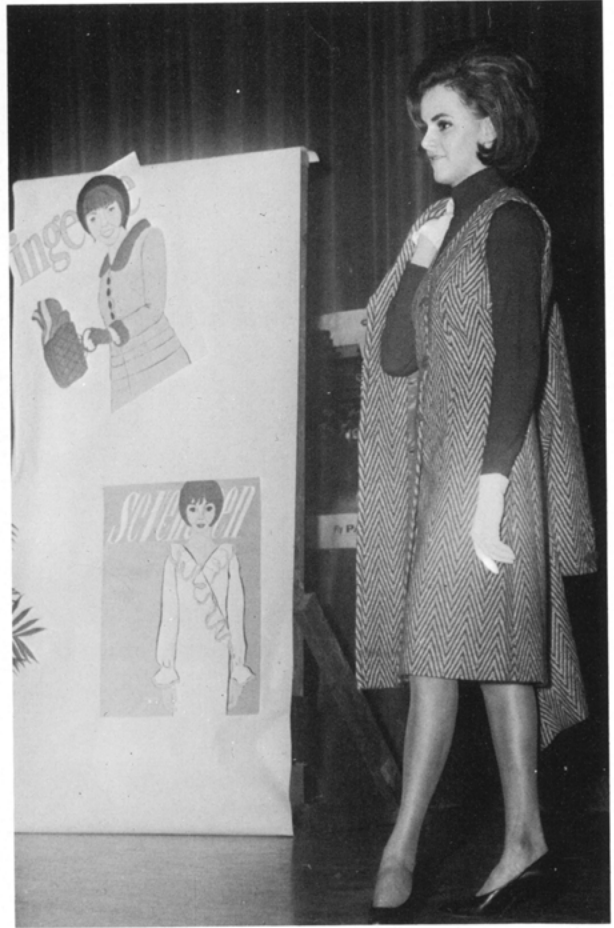

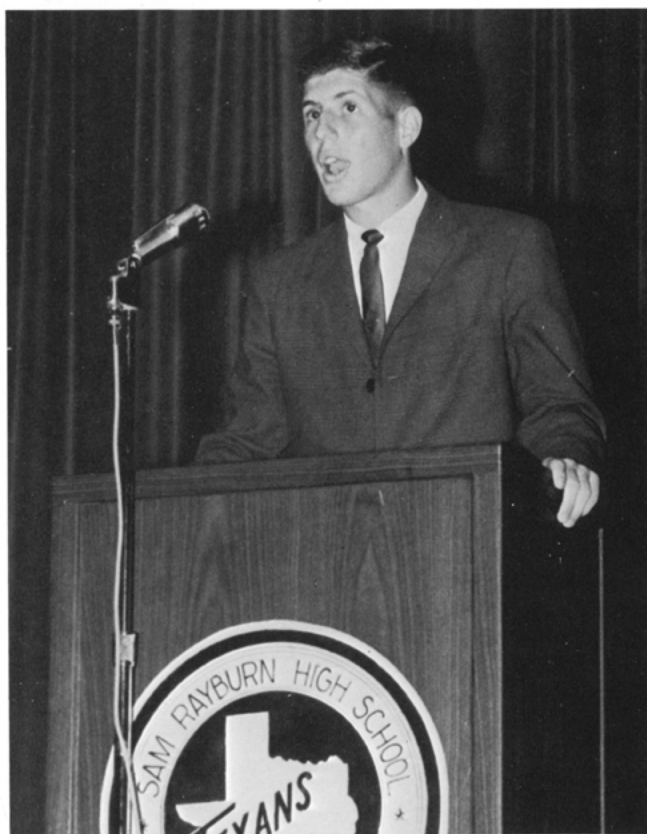

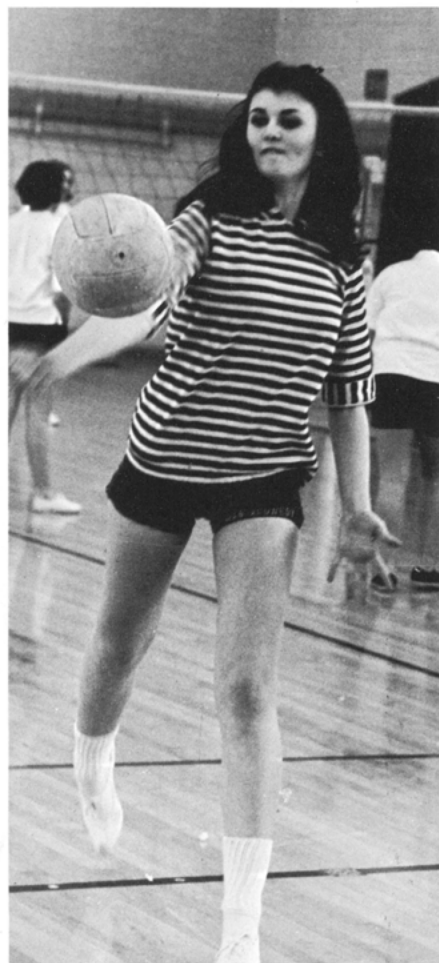
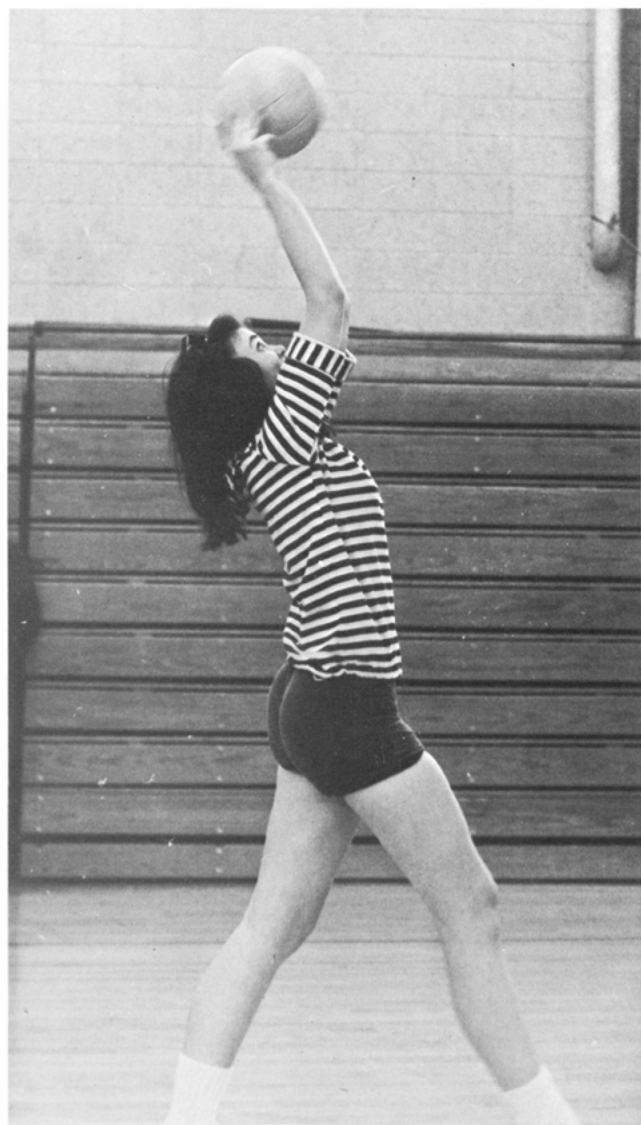

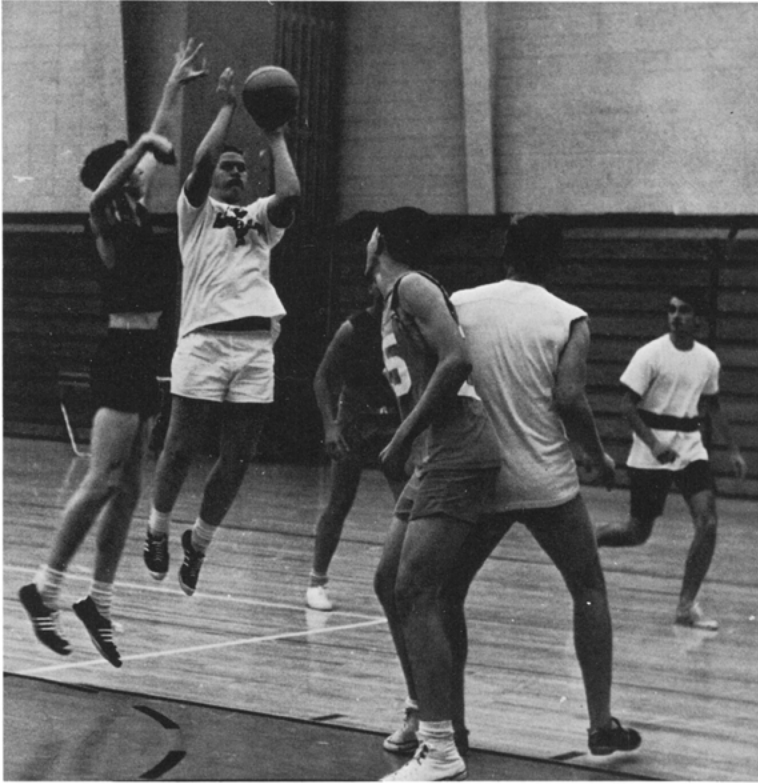

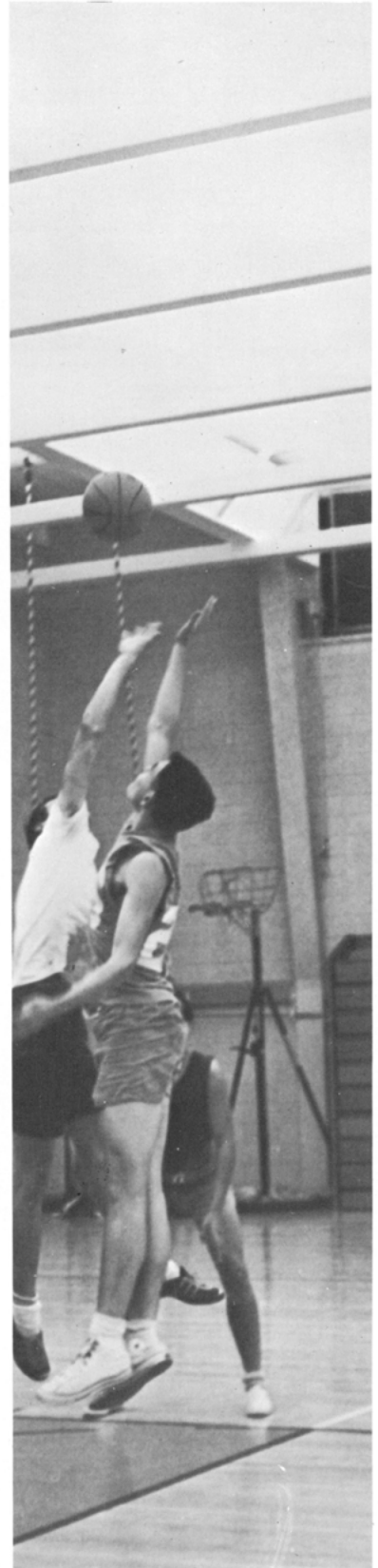

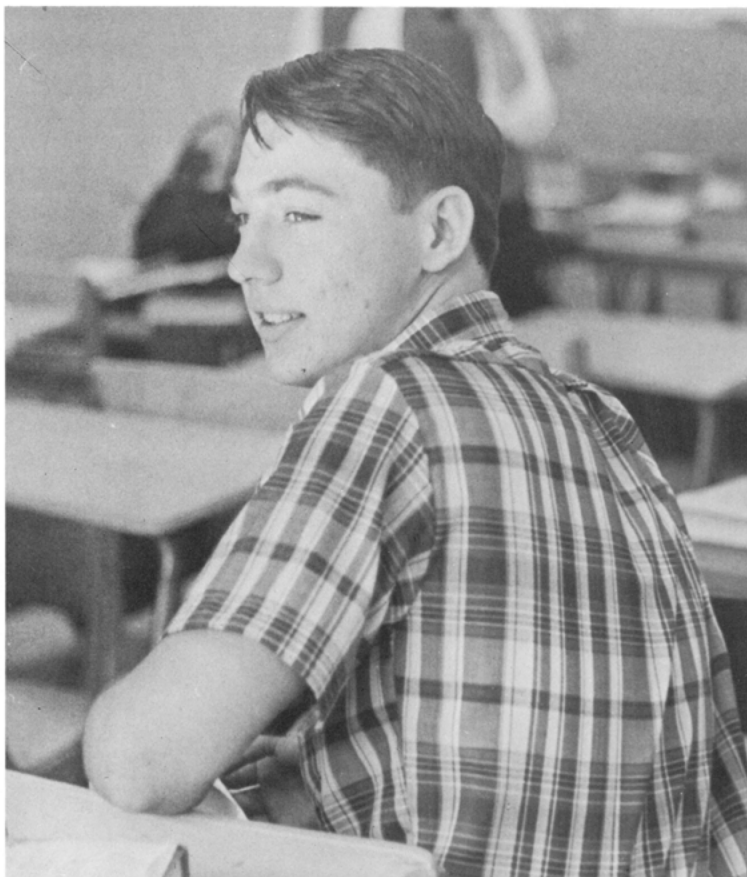

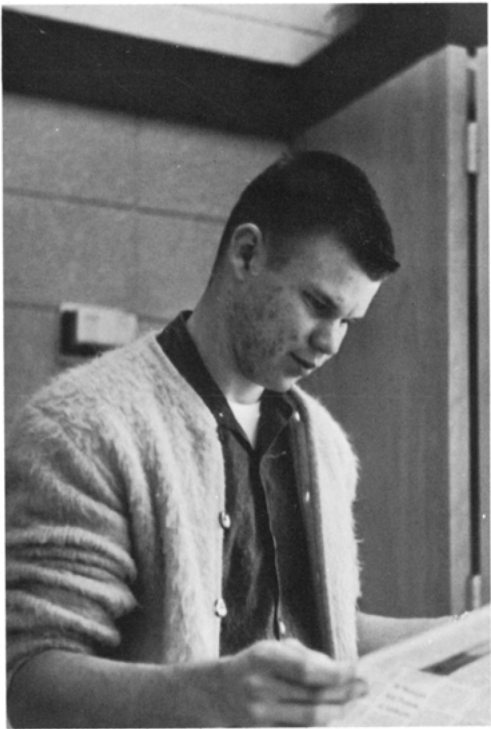

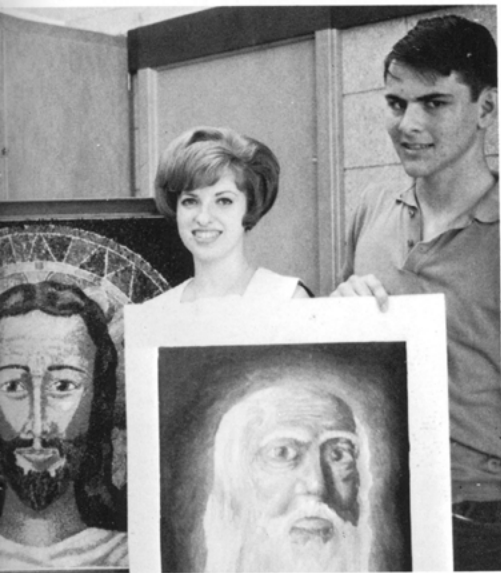

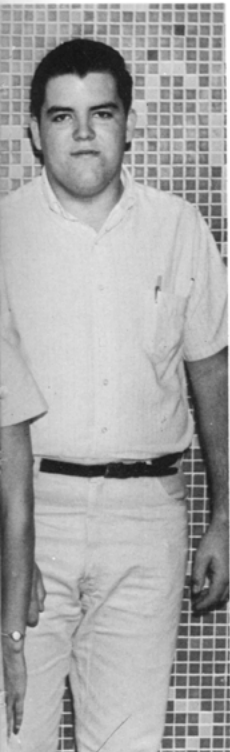

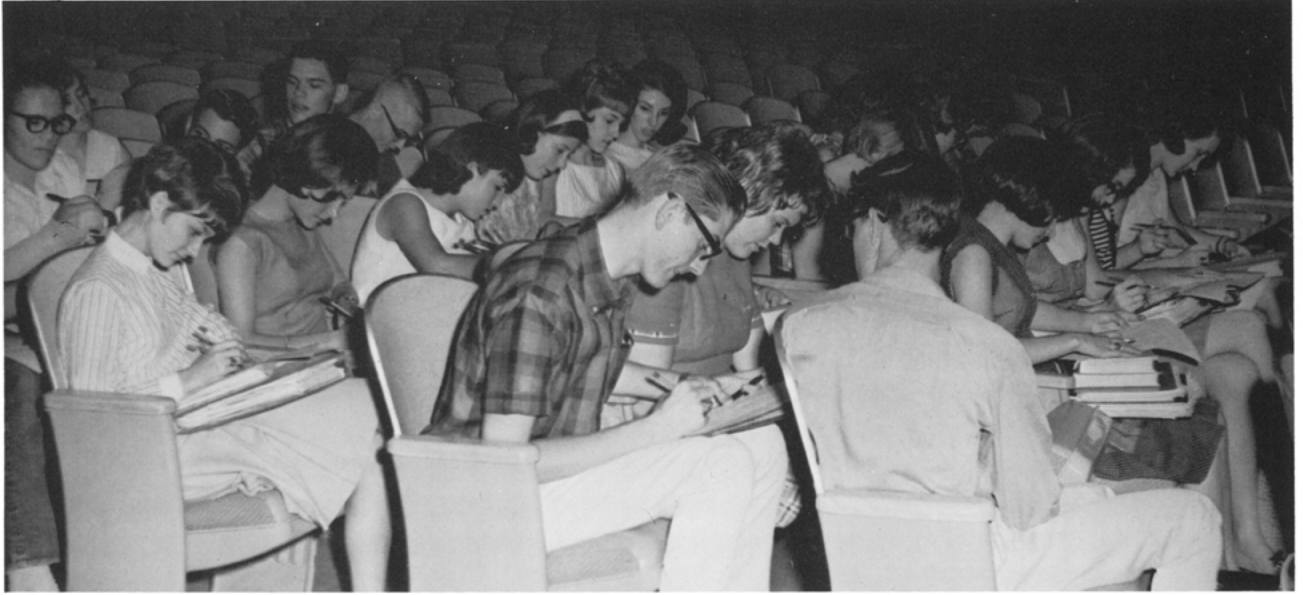

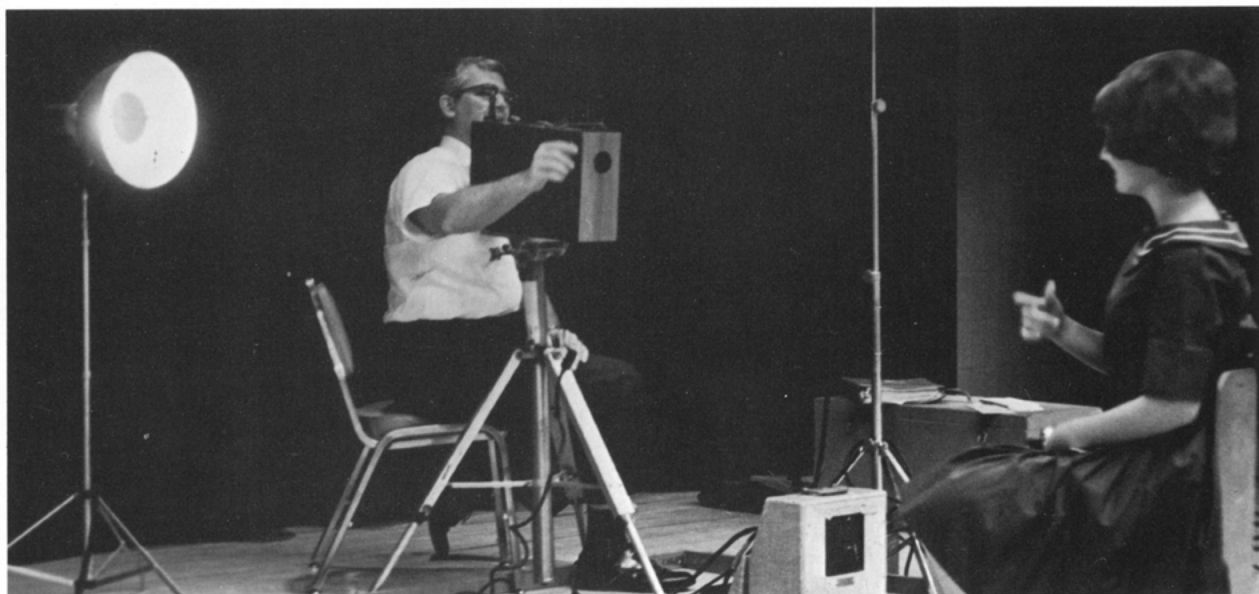

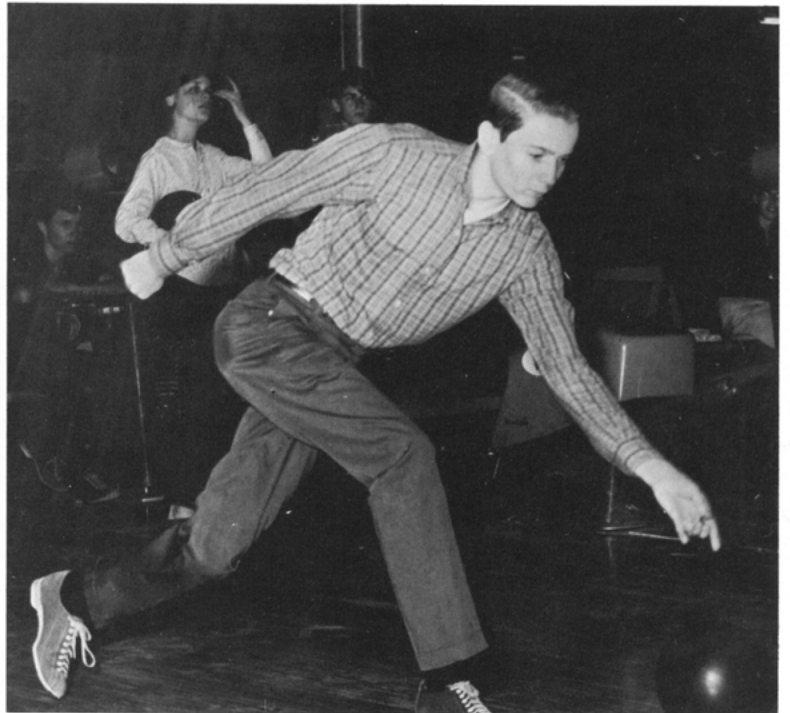

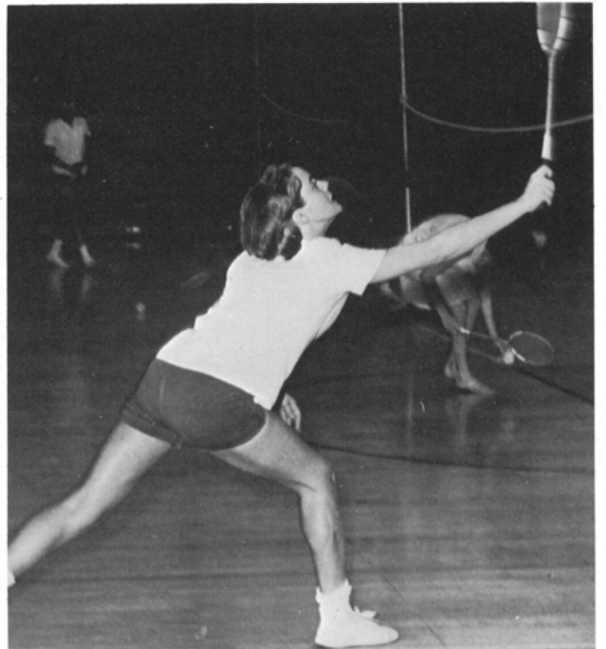
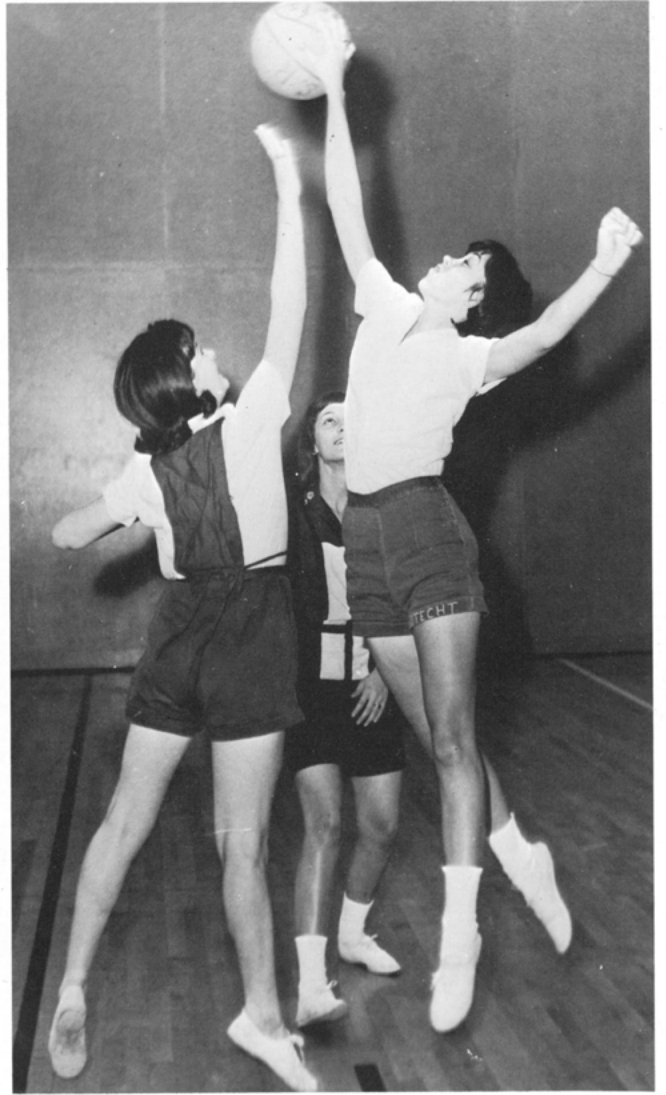

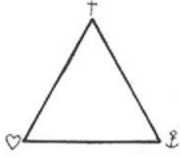
